

How to get a Provisional License or Competition license: General Information

- You must have an up to date copy of the NASA CCR in your possession while attending any NASA Event
- Know the CCR's- Appendix A, Appendix B, Sections 15 (safety Equipment), 16 (vehicle safety inspection), 18 (General Competition Vehicle Rules), 19 (Flags, signals, and Communication), 20 (Competition Format), 23 (Participant Conduct), 25 (on course conduct), etc.** The listed items are only a suggestion- All sections of the CCR should be well know to each participant.
- You need to have an up to date copy of the class rules for the series in which you compete
- Make sure you know who the NASA Officials are! It is our job to make sure you have a safe and fun racing weekend- we are here for YOU! <http://www.nasatxrcing.com/contact.php>

- Memberships expire on the date of your last renewal/ the date you first joined
 - Competition Licenses expire at the END OF EACH CALENDER YEAR
 - Medicals expire as indicated on the medical form and/ or comp license, based on the age of the applicant.

How to get a Provisional License: NASA CCR 13.0

** This information comes directly from the CCR

- To be considered for a provisional license, the driver must complete one of the following conditions:
1. Four days on track with an instructor; the last two days in a race car (**Note additional days may be required on a case by case basis depending on comfort level of candidate and instructors**)
 2. Pass a written test and technical compliance demonstration
 3. Approval of licensing instructor and event chairman (Director of Comp License)
 4. A NASA Tech Inspector must certify the race car
 5. Driver's attire must meet the NASA minimum standards for racing
 6. Submit a copy of your state driver's license
 7. Submit a copy of your NASA Physical Examination form
 8. Submit a copy of your driver resume
 9. Submit the appropriate fee

Note: The first weekend of licensing school may be waived with the approval of the Event Chairman for drivers with prior track experience (**NASA Texas- Event Chairman and/or Director of Comp Licensing**)

How to get a Provisional License if you have a license with another sanctioning Body

SCCA: CCR 13.1.2

1. Submit a copy of your Novice Permit with school requirements completed.
2. Submit a copy of your driver's License.
3. Submit a copy of your physical examination form (a full copy of a valid SCCA medical is acceptable, or submit a new, completed NASA physical exam form).
4. Submit a copy of driver resume.
5. Submit appropriate fee.

NASA or SCCA Vintage Licensing program: CCR 13.1.3

1. Submit proof of completion.
2. Submit a copy of your driver's license.
3. Submit a copy of your Physical Examination form (a full copy of a valid SCCA medical is acceptable, or submit a new, completed NASA physical exam form).
4. Submit a copy of a driver resume.
5. Submit the appropriate fee.

NASA or SCCA accredited racing school: CCR 13.1.4

1. Submit a copy of your Certificate of Completion.
2. Submit a copy of your driver's license.
3. Submit a copy of your Physical Examination form.
4. Submit a copy of a driver resume.
5. Submit the appropriate fee.

How to complete your Provisional License: CCR 13.1.5

- When you are issued a provisional license you will only be allowed to compete in the events hosted by the Region of issuance.
- Each time you complete a race without incident, you must obtain the signature of the Race Director (director of Comp Licensing) or his/her appointee.
- Once four races have been signed off, the provisional license is complete, and may be submitted along with the other requirements as listed in the "How to Get a Competition License" section to obtain a competition license.
- The provisional book must be filled out and turned into the Competition License Director at the beginning of each event and collected back at the end of the event.

****NOTE** NASA Texas - Upon successful completion of the Provisional License requirements, the completed Provisional License booklet must be turned into the NASA Texas Director of Comp Licensing. The booklet, as well as all previously submitted forms (physical, copy of DL, fees, etc) will be sent to NASA National so that a full National Competition License will be issued and mailed to the driver.**

Additionally, all Provisional license drivers are placed on ROOKIE status. Our standard practice in Texas is each new driver must complete four (4) races, starting from the back of the grid. Driver experience, school experience, etc, will be taken into consideration, but “4 from the back” is a mandatory requirement. We require this in an effort to get new racers comfortable with door to door racing without the added pressure of a possible mistake on L1/T1 of their first-ever race. It is not a “penalty”.

Upon successful completion of those four (4) races without incident, and with approval of the Comp License/Race/RaceCraft and/or Series Directors, they’ll be gridded based on qualifying time.

How to get a Competition License: CCR 14.1

- NASA Competition Licenses are only issued from the NASA National Office, and are honored by all Regions. The National Office will evaluate each candidate on a case by case basis and may issue a Competition License providing that the license candidate meet one of the following set of conditions:
 1. Submit your completed Provisional License (NASA Texas will submit the completed Provisional License booklet, in conjunction with all other forms already submitted by the driver).
 2. Submit a copy of your state driver’s license.
 3. Submit your completed NASA (or approved) Physical Exam Form.
 4. Submit the appropriate license fee.
 5. Submit a copy of a driver resume.
 6. Submit an Application for Competition License.

Hot to get a Competition License if you have a license with another Sanctioning body: CCR 14.1.1

SCCA or IMSA (PSR) license holders

Regional, national, pro:

1. Submit a copy of your current SCCA or IMSA (PSR) license.
2. Submit a copy of your state driver’s license.
3. Submit a copy of your last Physical Examination (a full copy of a valid SCCA medical is acceptable, or submit a new NASA Physical exam form).
4. Submit a copy of a driver resume.
5. Submit the appropriate license fee.
6. Submit an application for Competition License.

SCCA completed Novice Permit holders: CCR 14.1.3

1. Submit a copy of your completed Novice Permit.
2. Submit a copy of your state driver’s license.
3. Submit a copy of your completed SCCA (or approved) Physical Exam Form.

4. Submit a copy of a driver resume.
5. Submit the appropriate license fee.
6. Submit an Application for Competition License.

How to get a Waiver of License Requirements: CCR 14.2

** The Event Chairman may grant a temporary Waiver of License Requirements under one of the following conditions:

1. It is the driver's first race event of the NASA region and he/she shows proof of a currently valid SCCA, Grand Am, FIA, or IMSA (PSR) Road Racing license.
2. If the driver has completed the NASA Race Licensing Certification and has been approved by the Region's Licensing Instructor for a Provisional License.
3. If the driver is part of a "Co-Sanctioned Group" that holds a currently valid license with that group.
4. Except as in case number three above, the driver is must submit all required paperwork and fees for a NASA license before driving in the event. Number two and number three in this section is simply meant to waive the requirement of possession of a NASA license due to the time in transit required to obtain a physical license
